Doing things differently in West Seattle

PERMANENT NAMING OPPORTUNITIES

This capital campaign will be a permanent legacy for our community. Permanent naming opportunities are available at many gift levels at each project location.

\$1 million level

The Historic Cooper Cultural Arts Center

This naming opportunity creates the greatest visibility for the donor, including street-level marquee signage on this beautiful building, viewed by 30,000 passersby every day, and 75,000 patrons per year.

\$500,000 level

The West Seattle Food Bank & Community Resource Center building

This attractive new building is in a developing commercial district at the corner of two arterials -- 35th SW and Morgan -- with exterior signage viewed by thousands of commuters as well as visitors to the building.

The Croft Place complex

This beautifully designed, environmentally friendly community in the woods is surrounded by acres of green space. If desired, signage can be placed on the Delridge Way side of the property for greater visibility, although the property entrance is on 21st Avenue SW.

\$250,000 level

The Performance Hall at Cooper School

This 144-seat theater features a thrust stage and retractable seating so it is suitable for formal theater performances as well as flat-floor events such as dances, conferences and dinners. It will be the building's most active space.

The Croft Place Community Building

At the center of the Croft Place community and adjacent to the courtyard, this building provides space for resident gatherings, activities for children, and offices for partner agencies providing support to formerly homeless families.

The Food Bank Lobby

A key feature of the complex, this two-story, light-filled atrium space will advance the Food Bank's vision to serve patrons with dignity. This lobby provides a comfortable waiting area and a place to pick up information about services offered within the Community Resource Center and by its partner agencies.

\$100,000 level

The Green Room at Cooper

The most public of backstage spaces, this room occupies part of the old school gymnasium and features its wood floor and 20-foot ceiling. For congratulating performers on a job well done!

Dance Classroom at Cooper

This grand 1,200-square-foot rehearsal and performance space is also part of the old gymnasium, and features a wall of 15-foot windows.

Main Street Promenade Gallery at Cooper

The expansive Cultural Center hallway will feature art work and historical exhibits about the school and neighborhood.

The Conference Room at Community Resource Center

Opening onto the central courtyard, this room is available to tenant/partner organizations for meetings, trainings, classes and other events.

Multipurpose Classroom at Cooper

This classroom on the east side of the building will be a good music, art or meeting space for resident arts organizations and the general public.

Messy Workroom at Cooper

This large room in the northeast corner of the building is appropriate for various “messy” activities such as set painting, costume production and art fabrication.

Food Distribution Room at West Seattle Food Bank

This room is the heart and public face of the Food Bank. Its generous size will allow clients to select their own food from the shelves and move efficiently from the foyer through separate entrance and exit doors.

Theater Lobby at Cooper

A large corridor space with a huge skylight, this will be the gathering space during intermission and box office hours.

Entry Courtyard at Cooper

The main north entrance to the Historic Cooper Cultural Arts Center is designed to complement the historic building and reflect the center’s creative, community-oriented focus.

\$50,000 level

Media Lab at Cooper –Reserved by NUCOR Steel Seattle, Inc.

Food Sorting Room at West Seattle Food Bank

The volunteer soul of the Food Bank, this is where donations are sorted and bulk food packaged for clients. The improved size and layout of this room will make volunteering at the Food Bank an enjoyable experience for the more than 200 regular volunteers.

Community Room at Croft Place

Community creation at work! This space is for resident meetings, meals, activities for kids, parties, and other events – the business and pleasure of making a successful, supportive living environment.

Ticket/Concession Booth at Cooper

This high visibility booth, with room for espresso production and food display as well as cashiering, will be next to the theater lobby.

Residential Lobby at Cooper

A welcoming space for the artist residents of Cooper, the lobby will have mail and seating areas.

Residential Lobby at West Seattle Food Bank & Community Resource Center

A welcoming space for the 34 low-income families with children who will call the building home.

Southwest Interagency Academy Classrooms at Cooper (2)

These classrooms will be the new home of the Seattle School District's alternative middle school, which integrates an innovative curriculum with counseling and support for youth at risk.

Arts Corps Program Space at Cooper

A large central classroom and office area will accommodate the many classes and activities offered by Arts Corps.

Nature Consortium Program Space at Cooper

This classroom will house The Nature Consortium's administrative office and youth programs.

\$25,000 Level

Courtyard at Croft Place

The outdoor patio adjacent to the community building will be a social space for people to meet, greet and relax. Native forest plants and seating will be the features of this tranquil court.

Residential Galleries at Cooper (2)

Although generally not accessed by the public, these 2nd and 3rd floor residential hallways will be open during regular studio days and gallery sales.

Dressing Rooms at Cooper (2)

Male and female performers will enjoy the somewhat rare amenity of separate changing rooms with benches and lockers for personal belongings. Essential for performances involving youth.

Conference Room at Cooper

This meeting room in the main office will be used by all the anchor tenants.

Staff Break Room at Community Resource Center

This break room used by agency staff can also be an extension of the community meeting room by opening a movable wall for larger meetings.

Counseling Waiting Room at Community Resource Center

For use by the West Seattle Helpline and other agencies that use the upstairs offices at the Community Resource Center, this private waiting area will have space to post information and resources.

Residential Courtyard at the Community Resource Center

This piece of nature in the city will be the social center for residents; each unit will have a “front porch” onto this common space, which will be balanced between plantings and play areas.

Lighting Booth at Cooper

At the rear of the performance hall, this is the technical center of the theater, with sound, lighting and projection equipment.

Office #1 at West Seattle Food Bank

Opening off the food bank lobby, this will be the primary office for partner organizations that provide services during food distribution hours.

\$10,000 level

Program Partners Offices at West Seattle Food Bank (4)

These offices will offer partner agencies more privacy to meet with clients during food distribution.

Future Tenants (2)

The Community Resource Center provides roomy offices for tenant organizations around a central waiting area and shared conference room, with a separate entrance off of 35th Avenue Southwest.

Office and Workroom at Cooper

Adjacent to the Conference Room, this area houses the Cooper administrative office and a large workroom shared by tenant organizations.

\$5,000 level

Family Patio Tiles at Cooper (25+)

Individual tile creations by families, groups and artists will pave the north entry patio at Cooper Cultural Arts Center or the West Seattle Community Resource Center.

\$2,500 level

Lockers at Cooper (35+)

The historic student lockers lining the Main Street Promenade are a vivid reminder of the many children whose lives have been and will be touched at Cooper School.

\$1,000 level

Auditorium Seats (144)

These plush seats on risers retract to the back wall to create options for formal theater seating or informal flat-floor arrangements.

\$250 level

Individual Tiles

A tile engraved with your name on permanent display at Cooper Cultural Arts Center or the West Seattle Community Resource Center.
